From the Pastor,

Staying connected during these strange times of disconnection is at the heart of why we treasure the community of the church. I mean both connections to one another and to God. But it is not always clear how best to stay connected, when our primary Sunday gathering has been disrupted. So the Deacons, and Elders of Plymouth have a few new things we will be trying out.

The Deacons will work with Elder Wendy Wells to write a monthly column in the church newsletter devoted to our lives. Each month the column will feature a few people. The focus is not prayer concerns which are already shared through the email prayer chain, and on our online Sunday meeting. Instead interesting little tidbits like you might share during coffee hour will comprise this "church chatter". The goal is not lengthy reports on any one person, but just little snapshots of the whole variety of who we are.

Another possibility is in small groups. If you are interested in a small group of 4-8 people who would meet possibly outdoors, and appropriately socially distanced, with masks, etc., contact me or Elder Adrienne Schilling. We will provide resources to these groups for prayers or readings you might do together. Or if you already have such a group for fellowship but would like to add a spiritual element, I will provide resources, and could even attend one meeting to lead a prayer with you. Since we have decided to suspend our large in person worship gathering on Sunday morning in the sanctuary for a few more months because of health concerns and safety, this offers an opportunity for prayer time in person, with a few others.

We continue to emphasize our Sunday coffee hour and prayer time online at 11am. This is our primary gathering and we have been getting an average of 25 people weekly. If you want an invite and are not yet attending contact me by email. Other online classes and all this information are listed on our website, where you can find a half hour recorded worship service with a sermon, music and prayers.

If you would like to check out a book from the church library, or sit for an hour in the sanctuary and pray during the week, contact Gina Harrington to schedule an appointment. You will need to wear a mask while indoors, and we will sanitize the area after each visit. But this may provide another resource for some of us.

Whatever you are doing, it is probably not like it used to be. However, hopefully new patterns and even sacrifices and isolation can provide lessons in what is truly important in our lives. Most simply, if you feel lonely or depressed in these times, please call someone, or let them know when they call you. Our Deacons continue to pray for us all, and we trust in God's presence with us.

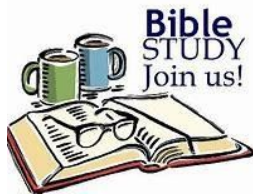

Peace and Global Witness Offering

We will continue to receive the Peace and Global Witness Offering in October. A gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. Individual congregations are encouraged to utilize up to 25% of this Offering to connect with the global witness of Christ's peace. Mid councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. The Session, at its September meeting, decided that our 25% portion will go to the Backpack for Kids. This program provides meals for food insecure children over weekends and holidays when school breakfast and lunch is not available. place for you. We are present in God's mission! Thank you for your support.

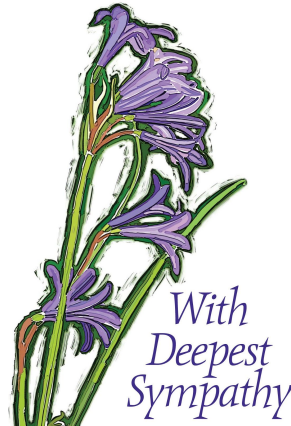

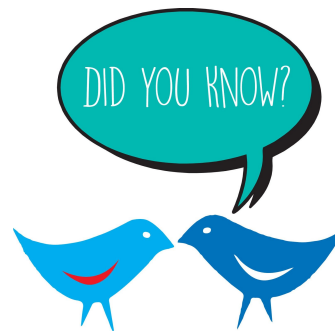


Fred Meyer Rewards
