Scripture reading is from John's gospel.

Account of feeding of 5000.

It's reported in all four gospels - - only differently.

Last week, we read that Jesus and the disciples retreated to a quiet lonely place to rest.

That's what happens just before this feeding.

Then they are surrounded by a huge crowd.

Our faith is **personal but not private**.

Combination of: Quiet time and gathered community.

So to set **the scene**:

Northern Galilee, green lush, hillside by lake.

John's account says that the withdrawal was to a mountain.

Actually the hills aground the sea of Galilee are not like mountains in Oregon.

I've been there...

Place called Tabgha

Everyone gathered and hungry.

Feeding and communion

This as model for our Lord's supper.

Jesus does not break but distributes in John.

Before the food is distributed, Jesus GIVES THANKS

The word: Eucharist.

Not breaking - - as in other places - - but here - - **thankfulness**...

What are you thankful for...?

Mosaic on ground in Tabgha - - of two fish and baskets.

This might reflect our practice here today...

You all brought communion elements today

We have **not done this in person for more than a year**.

Yet it is central to our faith.

This eucharist reflects a central piece of our faith as a feast of grace.

Have any of you missed this?

As we prepare to partake together, consider this **miraculous** sign of feeding:

John only reports that one boy had 5 loaves and two fish.

But afterward **there were leftovers!** / There was more than enough.

What we have - - is enough.
