Being welcomed in someone else's name is really an honor and a privilege. Whenever one of your adult children or grandchildren come to visit PPC, we welcome them in your honor. They get all the trust and the love that we have for you- it is a gift. Community is created through these bonds and extended relationships.

This is what Christ had in mind. The disciples were welcomed in his name even by strangers. My mom has been such a great aunt that basically anywhere I fly in the South- I can call a cousin who lives nearby if we get stuck at the airport. This really isn't an exaggeration. "Call cousin Mike" my mom said as we were stranded in Dallas because of weather. Sure enough he came and picked us up and we stayed the night with him; no questions asked. The goodwill built up from my mom was extended to me and my family too.

In the same way, we are all related in Christ, and we represent Christ to people. We are ambassadors coming in His name. An honor, a privilege and a responsibility.

Take time to do charity It is the key to Heaven

Prayer in action is love, and love in action is service. We are all God's children so it is important to share God's gifts"

By this community is formed. Dr. Bruce Tuckman, a psychology professor came up with the idea of a group development stages model. In short it can be summed up as Forming, Storming, Norming, Performing. As new people are welcomed into any community and other people leave, a natural phenomenon happens in the group. When a new pastor for example enters the equation, usually there is a time of forming as a ministry team with the pastor. Emotional connections and a shared vision form. Then maybe these connections will be strengthened and become more authentic through storming and going deeper. If communication is respectful and constructive the team will become stronger and more effective. As the team grows closer and learns to appreciate each other and how the different gifts brought complement one another and the whole church community, norming begins. Then as the team develops and continues to maintain respect for one another and true relationships grow, the performing begins.

As we are welcomed by God with open arms, we welcome others. Welcome of the other brings CHANGE and CHANGE is hard. It isn't a 4 letter word though. It's a 6 letter word that can open up new possibilities.
