• Dear Friends,

Gorillas burp when they are happy!

I didn't know that until I learned it from my 3 year old granddaughter on the way home from preschool recently. Discussing that fact led her to ask this question, "Grandpa, what makes you happy?" I had to pause to think seriously for a few moments. I found myself saying, "Hearing people laugh. That makes me very happy!" This Lent perhaps learning to laugh more would be something important to take on as a spiritual exercise. After all, Lent is a season of leaving off and taking on. What would make us happier? There is a recent podcast that sampled millions of students by enrolling them in a free class called the "Science of Well-being", led by Laurie Santos, a Yale University Psychology professor. You might think that things like a good job, more money, a perfect body would make us happier – but they don't improve our state of mind. What they found is that we mis-want, choosing what we think will make us happy but doesn't. [To be honest with you, my own historical practices for Lent to give up stuff like dessert, snacks, alcohol or social media have not increased my hunger toward God. No happiness increase at all. They have helped me shed a few pounds or made me look somewhat more pious for a moment or two, but that is all. They did, however deepen my focus on individualistic faith and personal improvement without any God-given and baptism-empowered purpose to pursue justice and peace for all God's people.]

So, what makes us happy? This Lent, I'm trying to WOOP it up! WOOP — Wish, Outcome, Obstacle, Plan — is the brainchild of Gabriele Oettingen, a professor of psychology at New York University and the University of Hamburg in Germany. It's a tool for helping us move beyond simply knowing what we ought to do to increase well-being, to actually changing our behavior. Reflect on questions like the following, answering each with three to six words:

Wish: What is my dearest wish, one that is challenging but possible?

Outcome: What would be the best outcome of fulfilling that wish?

Obstacle: What inside me holds me back from fulfilling this wish?

Plan: What specific action might overcome this obstacle?

After that, develop a simple if-then plan: if this obstacle happens, then I will do this thing. The point is not to hold on to the wish too tightly. I can't say yet whether WOOPing is making me happier. But it has transformed my experience of Lent. I have practiced almost every day, which has helped me see how often the obstacles I want to blame for a particular predicament are external. It has helped me get in better touch with what I actually wish for in my life with God, and the steps I can take to bring that closer to reality. And that, even in the midst of sorrow, has planted seeds of joy. My focus Bible passage for Lent is 2 Corinthians 6:10, "as sorrowful yet always rejoicing, as poor yet making many rich, as having nothing and yet possessing everything." So join me in WOOPing it up! 2023 IMPACT REPORT HELPING THE KIDS

NUTRITION

3,000+ people in 380 households benefitted from 5 rounds of bulk food relief plus a Holiday Food Basket.500+ children ate daily meals at the Center during school breaks.

135 of the neediest kids received vitamins and fresh produce monthly.

EDUCATION

538 children attended school regularly.34 graduated vocational or high school.17 children attended our Winnie Academy Preschool.

HEALTH

536 children were screened and dewormed 3 times.
888 clinic visits for minor illness or injury.
128 children received HIV care and medications.
6 children received specialized care and surgery for injuries, disease and deformity.

SAFETY & SHELTER

170 households received basic essentials like mattresses, mosquito nets, and solar lanterns.36 birth certificates were recorded, legitimizing children's identities.

GUARDIAN EMPOWERMENT

325 guardians were involved in income generating activities like raising goats, chickens and bees.

380 guardians have been trained on human rights, will writing, record keeping and basic financial literacy.
