Dear friends,

We begin Lent this month. It's a challenge to live intentionally: To rediscover the beauty of purpose and reflection—a chance to gently realign our hearts with what truly matters. FINANCE NOTES & NEWS

Several annual and quarterly expenses contributed to the \$2,346 operating budget deficit in January.

In 2024, Plymouth Church earned \$6,337 in dividends from Certificates of Deposit invested at InRoads Credit Union. An additional \$118 was earned from savings interest and merchant rewards. The total income from all of these sources was \$6,455.

Session has approved the purchase and installation of new blinds for the Sanctuary windows. The Finance Committee recommended using memorial funds for these beautiful blinds. We will dedicate them after they are installed (approx. 6 weeks).

The Alice Brewer Bequeathment accounting is as follows: \$43,526 reserved to savings; \$23,768 spent on improvements (piano, concrete, fellowship blinds) plus a mission donation (Warm Springs Manse); with \$19,758 remaining to spend.

HOW TO MAKE AN ONLINE DONATION

Using the camera function on your smart phone, aim your phone at the QR code found on the card in the pew rack. Tap the website link "secure.myvanco.com" that will appear on your screen. (Vanco is the Presbyterian Foundation's administrator.) The next screen you see will be Plymouth Church's secure online portal. You can also type https://plychurch.org into your computer browser. On the home page, scroll down until you see the GIVE NOW button. Click the button to access the online portal.

There's also an App for your Smart Phone.

Plymouth Church is also listed in the Vanco Mobile App, making online giving on a smart phone even easier. Plymouth has a unique invite code for the Vanco Mobile app, which can be used as a search term. Our unique invite code is HDS.

EASTER BRUNCH



Around the world, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity. The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) — Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People — all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope.

Received during the season of Lent (March 5 – April 20), each gift to OGHS helps to improve the lives of people in these challenging situations. The Offering provides us a way to share God's love with our neighbors in need. In fact, OGHS is the single, largest way Presbyterians come together every year to work for a better world.



<u>PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE (PDA)</u>: works alongside communities as they recover and find hope after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters, and support for refugees. PDA receives 32% of funds received.

<u>PRESBYTERIAN HUNGER PROGRAM (PHP)</u>: takes action to alleviate hunger, care for creation and the systemic causes of poverty so all may be fed. PHP receives 36% of funds received.

<u>SELF-DEVELOPMENT OF PEOPLE (SDOP)</u>: invests in communities responding to their experiences of oppression, poverty and injustice, and educates Presbyterians about impacts of these issues. SDOP receives 32% of funds received.
