What's Next for Plymouth as we move into November? Small Steps, Big Heart

Let's be honest — we're not the bustling church we used to be. We're smaller now, and yes, most of us have a few more birthdays behind us. But that doesn't mean the story's over. It means that God's inviting us to write a new chapter — one filled with connection, kindness, and hope.

So what's next for Plymouth? It comes down to three simple ideas: Invite. Welcome. Befriend.

Invite -- Growth starts with a simple invitation. Not everyone is ready to come to worship on a Sunday morning -that's okay. Some people might first say yes to a movie night, pancake breakfast, or gardening day. Others might love a "Stories of St. Helens" afternoon or a craft-and-coffee get-together.

Think about your own circle of friendship — a neighbor you wave to, a friend from your walking group, or someone you see at the grocery store. Most folks are just waiting for a reason to say yes. You could simply say, "Hey, our church is doing something fun this weekend. Want to come along?" Invitations work best when they're personal and warm.

Welcome -- When someone shows up, let's make sure they feel at home. A smile, a handshake, and a simple "Hi, I'm [Your Name], I'm glad you came today!" go a long way.

You can ask, "What brought you to town?" or "Have you lived in St. Helens long?" and then just listen. Everyone has a story. Walking with someone to coffee hour or helping them find a seat might seem small, but it tells them, "You belong here."

Befriend -- Inviting and welcoming open the door — friendship builds the home. Be ready to hear great stories and to learn something new. People will surprise you — with humor, with heart, and with courage.

Friendship takes time, but it's worth it. Send a short note, text, or invite them for coffee later in the week. These small gestures can make a big difference. As we listen, laugh, and share life together, we'll see how God keeps weaving new relationships right into the fabric of our church.

Will This Change the Plymouth Family?

Yes — and that's a good thing! When we open our hearts wider, the Plymouth family doesn't shrink — it stretches. We'll see new faces, hear new ideas, and feel fresh energy in the room. We might sing new songs, share new laughter, and find joy in unexpected places.

The love that's carried Plymouth through the years is still here — it's just growing in new directions.

Our Next Step

Here's a simple challenge: this month, invite one person, welcome one guest, and befriend one newcomer. That's how change begins — one friendly step at a time. God's still doing something beautiful here at Plymouth. Let's keep walking into it, together.

LEARNING POD AT PLYMOUTH

Hello, neighbors! I'm Dr. Jesse Watson, Executive Director of Sheridan AllPrep Academy (SHAPA). I grew up right here in St. Helens (back then as Jesse Eisenschmidt), so this town will always feel like home. When I set out to bring new educational opportunities to St. Helens, I asked if anyone had space for one of our school's learning pods. Thanks to the wonderful welcome from Plymouth Presbyterian Church, I now get to combine two things I love: my hometown and my work.

Sheridan AllPrep Academy is a free, statewide public charter school that blends online learning with small, in-person "pods" where students can connect and grow together. We have pods in Sheridan, McMinnville, and Scappoose, and our newest pod meets right here at **Plymouth Presbyterian Church** in St. Helens. SHAPA serves about 400 Oregon students and has been around since 2009.

Three days a week, our K-5 students get extra academic help, work on projects, and simply enjoy being with friends and their teacher. Families love the flexibility of online schooling combined with a friendly, supportive place to belong, and we value the close relationships we build with homeschool families who want to stay deeply involved in their children's education.

We're so grateful to Plymouth Presbyterian for opening its doors and sharing space with us—it truly makes this pod feel like part of the community. The Net Operating Budget shows a surplus of \$6,866 for the month of September and a surplus of \$1,794 for YTD 2025. All the income timing issues that occurred in August were resolved this month. Therefore, the YTD 2025 reflects a more accurate picture of Plymouth's financial status with a modest YTD budget surplus!

PLYMOUTH RESERVES

As of September 30, Plymouth Church had \$53,269 in checking and savings; plus \$128,089 in certificates of deposit and a money market. These continue to be strong reserves.

CONGRATS, PRES. OF THE CASCADES!!

Two of our national staff people for the PCUSA attended our Presbytery meeting last weekend (held in person at Westminster-Salem). They led a workshop, and made presentations in the general meeting. One of their announcements was that our Presbytery, Presbytery of the Cascades, is **Number One** of all the Presbyteries in the number of churches participating in the Four Special Offerings of the church! What a fun achievement! Each church participating in all four offerings was then given a certificate acknowledging their gifts. (Yes, Plymouth received one!)

We were also told that, beginning in 2026, the four offerings will be reorganized into three offerings: One Great Hour of Sharing (Lent), World Communion Offering (Fall) and Christmas Joy (Advent). All of the same groups will be receiving the funds; those who had received from the Pentecost Offering will be added to the ones who had received from Peace and Global Witness.

Goal: Make sure children are enrolled and attending school.

The website tells us that, "Behind every school uniform is a story of perseverance – and it's your generosity that helps turn those stories. Into bright futures.

"Thanks to your partnership, children had the chance to walk into a classroom wearing their new uniforms with pride. From early learners to vocational students, school fees, uniforms and supplies were fully covered. The new national curriculum is in full swing, and MCC [Makindu Children's Center] children are adjusting beautifully with the guidance of their teachers and mentors.

"Outcome: High school retention and academic performance continue to improve – testimony to the steady support and commitment of MCC and its partners."
